Pastors' Paragraphs


When our kids were growing up Steven Curtis Chapman wrote a song called "The Great Adventure" and it kind of became our vacation theme song. I love adventure and whether we were headed to Yellowstone or Yosemite we would pop in the Steven Curtis Chapman cassette tape! I love the song because it describes the Christian life as the great adventure - which it is! I've had some adventure in life and living for Jesus has been a constant adventure unlike any other. One of the things learned early on was that you have to know how to prepare for whatever adventure you're headed off on. It was good to have some expert advice on backpacking to prepare for a 30 mile (round trip) hike into Havasupai Canyon or tent camping the Great Northwest.

"The Great Adventure" - The Christian Life is the same way. We need to know what we need for the journey. Will it be hot or cold, wet or dry. How many people are we walkin' or drivin'. Is all our gear in a backpack or a big ol truck and will there be dangerous critters out there? There's a lot to figure on and prepare for. But!! One of the things I'm afraid we've done is not prepare others well for the adventure and a lot of folks have not survived. Jesus said we should "count the cost" of following Him - (Luke 14:28) and the "cost" is 'all that we have and all that we are'- vs.

33. The reason for that is that there is so much that not only is not necessary for the journey but much that makes it impossible to finish the adventure. By the way He also promises that He will provide all of our needs and that is a promise that He always keeps if we <u>Trust Him</u>.

In the months ahead we want to be about preparing folks for the adventure and making the trip together.

We know the great commission says to make disciples and everything we do should do that.



We will be utilizing a resource called "Disciples Path" and the process looks something like this:

We will supplement the first book important "Base Camp" with information about our church's structure, strategy and affiliation to help potential members get a feel for who we are before "signing up." Each book in the series six sessions that truly "equips folks for the journey." We will go through the series on Sunday mornings during the bible study hour or meet at other times or places as the need arises. Existing adult classes can pick a book or continue to do what they are doing now. This likely be a slow transition of adding classes but the goal will be to offer classes at whatever level of growth folks are at.

All this to prepare all us for The Great Adventure.

We will keep you informed on opportunities to be trained and equipped.

There will be a sign up sheet in the lobby. Please be sure to sign up as we need to have an accurate count.



Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous! Do not tremble or be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9 NASB

The King James bible version includes 29 instances of the phrase "be not afraid." The New American Standard Bible includes the phrases "do not fear" 57 times and "do not be afraid" 46 times.
